



“WIA Vancouver announces B.C.’s Five in Focus: Animation”

Vancouver, August 11, 2018

Today at the Women in Animation (WIA) Vancouver Summit, WIA and Women in View (WIV) announced an ambitious new initiative that will take effective and concrete steps to advance women in animation. With major funding from TELUS and financial support from Telefilm Canada, Canadian Media Producers Association– BC Producers Branch (CMPA-BC) and Creative BC, **B.C.’s Five in Focus: Animation**, will bring together leaders in British Columbia's animation industry to identify five women who will be offered a suite of opportunities and resources, including a budget to create an original animated short.

The five selected for the program will represent the key creative positions in animation: screenwriter, director, producer, art director and animation director – positions in which women are underrepresented. The program will help to significantly advance these women’s careers through extensive mentorship from the WIA community, exposure to a wide-range of industry activities, master classes, pitch training and more. Over the course of a year, the participants will develop and produce an animated short film which will premiere at Spark 2019. Not only will the Five have the experience of making an original film and the all-important credit that goes with it, they will also have the opportunity to attend a major market to pitch with their work and network with industry executives.

Unlike advancement projects which call for applicants, **Five in Focus** asks industry leaders to actively search out talented women in their field who they believe deserve greater recognition and opportunities for true advancement. Once nominees for each of the key roles of screenwriter, director, producer, animation director and art director are identified, the finalists will be selected by an esteemed jury of industry professionals

representing the BC animation community. B.C.'s Five in Focus: Animation finalists and jury will be announced in October at Spark 2018.

Launched by Women in View in 2017 as a three-year initiative, Five in Focus was designed to engage media industry leaders in the process of identifying and supporting Canadian women media creators.

"Five in Focus was one of the most professionally gratifying experiences for me," said director Gloria Ui Young Kim, one of the 2017 Five in Focus directors. It was instrumental in helping me sign with an agent as well as getting me in front of producers which resulted in my first TV directing jobs."

In its second year Women in View partnered with Women in Film and Television-Atlantic and Telefilm Canada to turn the spotlight on five women from the Atlantic region. Now, in its third year, with the support of TELUS, Creative BC, Telefilm Canada and CMPA-BC, the program is focusing on West Coast animation talent.
